How to get to Eve's Garden

Eve's Garden is located in by the Riverbed of Saint Michael's river, approximately one hours drive from the San Ysidro Border.

You take the highway on and Exit at the La Mision and La Fonda exit, before you get to "Playa la Mision".

This is also the exit leading to the Wine Valley, Valle de Guadalupe.

If you get to "Play La Mision" you have gone too far.

From the Exit you drive parallel with the highway for about a mile, until you cross under the highway and drive inland.

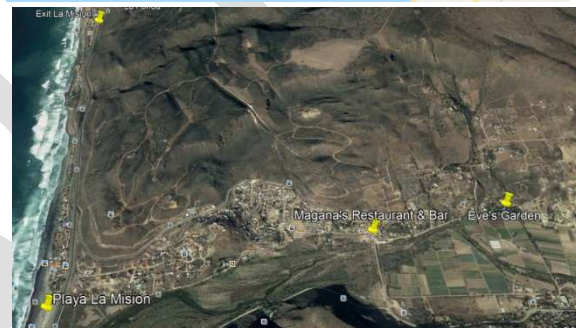
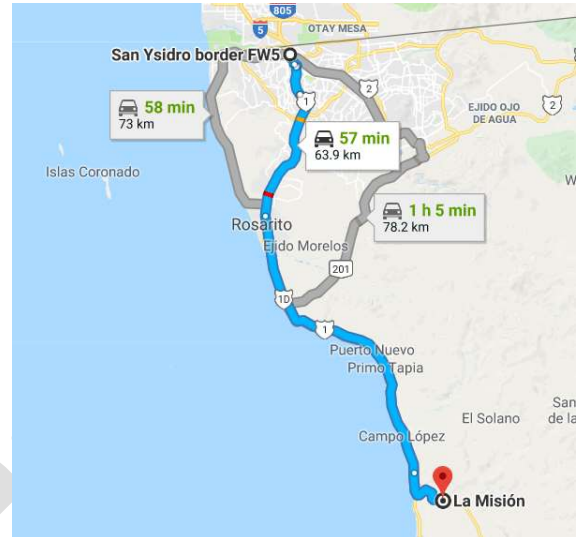
Continue until Maganas restaurant, located on your right just before the bridge across the San Miguel river.

Here you turn left on an unnamed dirt road that runs on the left side of the riverbed.

About ½ a mile down the dirt road, you will see a sign for "Rancho Magana" pointing up a steep road. Don't go up this road, but less than 100 feet after it comes a small gated area with two houses on your left.

This is the "Community Exchange and Sharing center", and the next exit, a few feets after, is the the first entrance to Eve's Garden.

Drive in there, and there is a small parking area when you turn left after a about 100 yards.
